


SPANISH NEWS- 6th Grade Projects

Trip to Rome and the Italian Countryside

In 2017, I went to Italy with my mother. I traveled the countryside of the Abruzzo Region, and Rome, the eternal city. I visited many historical and cultural sites, such as Vatican City, which is the smallest country in the world. It is located in a capital of a country. It was worth it to take a guided tour and learn a lot of new information. I enjoyed beautiful pieces of art from several famous sculptors and painters such as Michelangelo. I saw the Colosseum, a 1,949 year old wonder that was built in 70 anno domini (AD). The modern day Colosseum is in ruins from an earthquake in 1349, which destroyed much of the outer southern side of the architecture. Fortunately, most of the building survived and can now be viewed by those who would like to.




The Colosseum was the place that hosted Gladiator fights. The men fought with each other, as well as animals. They were injured and even killed in the fights. It was a very dangerous activity, but paid well if gladiators were free men and fought well. Sadly, this was done for entertainment and it was as cruel as it sounds. The last known gladiatorial fight in Rome was on January 1, 404 A.D.

In Rome, the oldest fountain in Italy can be found. It is called the Trevi Fountain. The Trevi Fountain was completed in 1762 and has been a tourist attraction ever since. Did

you know that the fountain was built from the same material as the Colosseum? In addition, it has been featured in multiple movies and has even been replicated at Epcot in Disney World! But, many horrible things have happened to the fountain. In 2007, a vandal dumped red liquid substance into the fountain, turning the water red. This caused the water that fell from the fountain to also be red, since the fountain used a closed circuit water system. Many feared that the red liquid combined with the water would permanently damage the monument, so the water inside the fountain was quickly drained. Thankfully, there is no damage shown today.

According to an old legend, visitors should stand with their backs to the fountain and throw coins with their right hand over their left shoulder to ensure they'll return to Rome in the future. Did you know that it is illegal to fish out coins from the Trevi Fountain? A gang of thieves often stole coins from the fountain at night. Three were even caught by a hidden camera in 2011. The most famous raider was nicknamed d'Artagnan. He raided coins from the fountain for 34 years until he was caught in the summer of 2002.



We also traveled to the Italian Countryside, and had the world's best gelato, in a small village called Sulmona. The line outside was a mile long, but it was worth the wait! No wonder it earned Europe's best gelato award 2 years in a row! Continuing our ride, we arrived in another small village that is

not too far away from Sulmona. Its residents can enjoy a breathtaking panorama of the surrounding mountains daily. The village was built into the mountain and has only necessities! A doctor, an elementary school, a bakery, a butcher shop, narrow, curvy cobblestone streets, and lots of smiling, curious faces. The nearest grocery store is a few miles away, but the village is nice and quiet. The majority of the villagers do not speak English though. We stayed at a friend's house for a few days and I enjoyed socializing with her children.

In Italy, there is more than just the pizza and pasta, there is a whole culinary empire! For breakfast, we enjoyed cappuccinos, traditional bread and jam, and different types of cookies. Our appetizer for lunch was cantaloupe and prosciutto. Then, on to the main course which we would eat a variety of foods ranging from beef to seafood, salad to cheese. Finally, for dessert we would eat tiramisu. It is a coffeeflavored dessert made of ladyfingers soaked in coffee, layered with a mixture of eggs, sugar, and mascarpone cheese, flavored with cocoa. It did definitely "carry me up" as its name stands for. Dinner would also be a variety of meats and vogurt with fresh fruits or gelato for dessert.



Who doesn't know the basic pizza and toppings? Most will imagine it with tomato sauce, cheese, and pepperoni, but there is more to the story. Pizza was created on June 11, 1889, to honor the Queen Margherita of Savoy. The Neapolitan pizza


maker Raffaele Esposito created the "Pizza Margherita", a pizza garnished with tomatoes, mozzarella, and basil, to represent the national colors of

Because these










PIXEL ART- Kirby

Now, finally Super Smash Brothers Ultimate. Super Smash Brothers Ultimate is the newest game of the series and now the second best game. Melee holds the top spot but this new game is a runner-up. Returning most of the competitive, 72 characters in total and 108 stages. The game added back all the removed characters and even new characters. TECHNOLOGY: Evolution of Windows

Good old Windows: The marketing world owned by Microsoft in their OS. But really, looking back on it, Windows 1.0 was barely even user friendly.

Windows 1.0 was nowhere near user friendly. There is a website to visit and try out Windows 1.0 by clicking here. Your desktop is actually what would be File Explorer, which has all the files. There is EXE, which is a normal program like Notepad.exe or Calendar.exe. There is DOC and TXT, which are about the same: but DOC files would soon become Microsoft Office.



After that, not much is publicly known. There's only about six paragraphs of the history between Windows 2.x and 3.x as well as the OS/2 format.

Windows 95 was developed after that. Windows was about to get its name. Again, there is a Windows 95 website you can run here. Windows 95 allowed for minimizing, which lets you pause and work on something. This was also the first 32-bit system. Bits mean that 1-bit lets you use 2 characters: 0 & 1. So 32-bit lets you use 64 characters for more flexible kinds of coding.

Before that, a CD-ROM was backed up online code named Rainbow. It was a prototype build of Windows NT that used the Start menu feature. However, the source website is available here. Rumors about Windows Rainbow have spread, like its release in 1993 or what the default browser was. Most of it contains programs like Cat Explorer, which focused on loading high-quality images and vector-formatted text, which you could zoom into without it losing its quality.

Windows 98, Windows NT 4.0 and 50, Windows ME, and Windows 2000 are barely any different to each-other. In my opinion Windows 98 was the best out of them all.


In 2001, we were introduced to Windows XP. There is a screenshot load of Windows XP you can run clicking here. It ran away from the MS-DOS kind of scripting and allowed them to create imagery within a kernel: It's just like a popcorn kernel! When it pops, or released to developers to build on, they start adding heat and flavor to the popcorn kernel. Eventually, it finishes popping and is released. Then, you add extras like buttery security updates and a pinch of e-mail programs.



We are now entering the modern age of Windows! Unfortunately, many people think that Vista is the worst Windows. Vista introduced very nice concepts: A seethrough Aero Glass theme, Gadgets you can add on the screen like a clock or calendar, and a double-paneled start menu with icon toggle. Windows XP originally did this, but icons were for everything. At least you can use Vista here.

Windows 7 was nothing new to the table. We got mostly upgraded performance and DirectX 11, which was when 3D gaming processor that was very detailed now. This is PS3 and XBox 360 eras right now, so Windows stepped up to the game with this DirectX card. Again, you can use Windows 7 here.

Windows 8.1. Here's an example of how much the 2010's were all about people modernizing than anything else: on the left we have pressing the Windows key on Windows 7 and on the right is the same input on Windows 8.1:



Not very appealing to many. And, for the last time, here's an emulator for Windows 8.1 you can go to by clicking this.

And here we are today: Windows 10. Cortana can search your computer straight from the taskbar. Microsoft Edge releases and gets used the least in the world. And, they made the start menu upgrading from



Windows 8's full screen start menu. At HMS, our computers use Windows 10, so you can picture what Windows 10 looks like.
